All of this progress and collaboration is being threatened by budget cuts—cuts that would end elementary music education—the foundation for the cluster's music program—and lead to staff reductions.

Past budget cuts have already changed how music education is funded. At PLHS, the San Diego Unified School District provides funding only for the Director's salary, while the program must cover expenses for music, instruments, instruction, uniforms, transportation, and competition fees at an annual cost of \$70,000 – and the program is growing!
